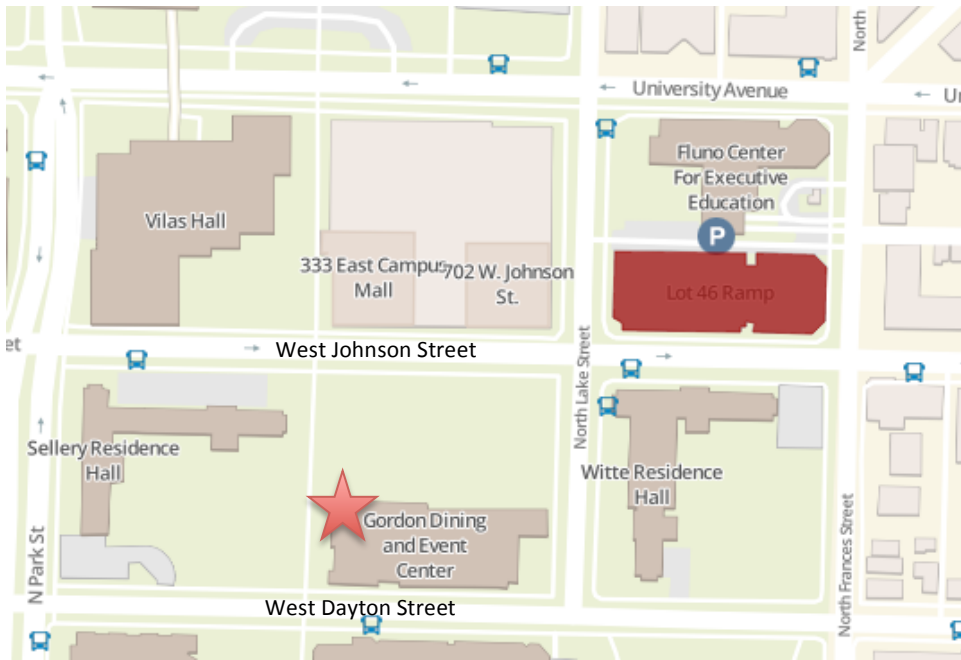

### Parking Information

Parking is not included with registration. Public parking is available one block away from Gordon Dining and Event Center in **Lot 46**, located at Johnson & Lake Street (see map). Entrance to the ramp is on Lake Street.

*Lot 46 has a \$12 per day maximum. Daytime and Evening visitor parking is “pay on exit”. Visitors pull a ticket on entry and then pay by credit card (VISA or MC) at a Pay on Foot Station or at the exit lane column upon leaving.*
