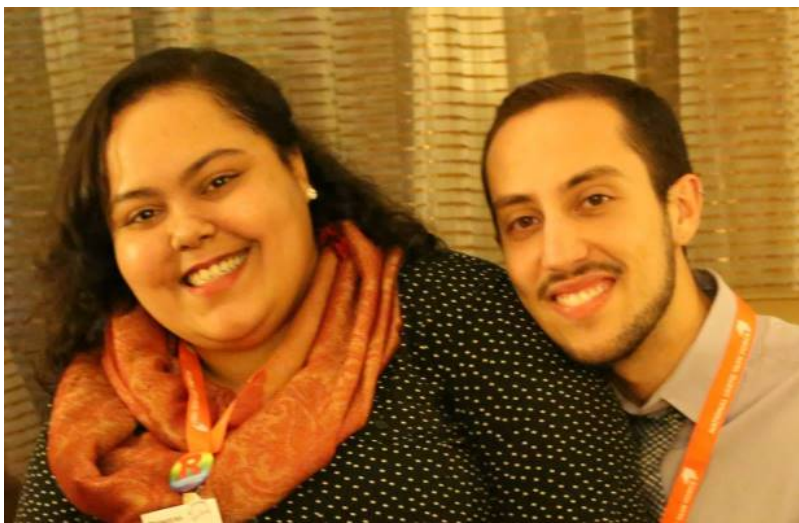

The institute will take place at the Nebraska Union on University of Nebraska Lincoln's campus, located at 14th and R Street in Lincoln, Nebraska.
